FACULTY OF ARCHITECTURE UNIVERSITY OF LISBON

THE UNIVERSITY

The Faculty of Architecture (FA), or simply “the School” as people call it, since it dates back to the 16th century, is now one of the 18 faculties and institutes belonging to the University of Lisbon, following the recent merger between the classical University of Lisbon and the Technical University of Lisbon. The scientific areas covered by the newly formed university range from sciences and engineering to the arts and the humanities, and include architecture and design. It has an intake of over 40.000 students and is one of the top European universities in the Shanghai ranking.

ULisboa has several campuses in various locations in Lisbon. The FA is one of four faculties located in the Ajuda Campus in the west of Lisbon, on a hill close to the Monsanto Park, 20 min from the city centre.



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THE SCHOOL

The Faculty of Architecture (FA) offers courses leading to the award of the Bachelor's, Master's and PhD degrees in Architecture, Urbanism and Design. It also offers non-degree courses which provide further training for professionals who wish to extend their knowledge. This broad training offer makes the FA the largest and most diversified school in the country in its specialist areas, with an intake of approximately 3,000 students. It is also the school with the largest number of foreign students, who come from Europe as well as other continents where the FA has exchange agreements. In addition, it is the oldest school in Portugal, with a history dating back to the 16th. century.

The main feature of this Faculty is the training offered through design studio project work in the 1st and 2nd cycles, in which the knowledge acquired in all subject areas is applied to the design of a broad range of possible objects, from small-scale to territorial. However, the aim of the FA is to train a wider range of professionals to work as consultants, researchers and public sector staff in areas associated with the built environment, culture and industry.

It is, without doubt, these combined objectives which have ensured that over 95% of its graduates find employment within a year of completing their courses.

The FA is currently investing in training professionals who can work in Portuguese society and help increase its potential for innovation, competitiveness and exports. For this reason, special emphasis is placed on the development of final projects and dissertations produced in collaboration with public and private entities, encouraging entrepreneurialism and creating future opportunities for students. Training in the 3rd cycle is directed towards advanced research in the three subject areas of the FA within the framework of the CIAUD, a research centre classified as Excellent by the Portuguese Foundation for Science and Technology. A service provider centre, technology transfer office and business incubator have recently been created. As a modern school which aims to combine tradition and innovation, the FA is a leading institution providing professional training for architects, urban planners and designers, and recognised in the field of specialist interdisciplinary research.

ORGANISATION

The School is organised into two academic departments: Architecture, Urbanism and Design; and Social Sciences, Arts, and Humanities. Each of these departments is divided into sections corresponding to the School's disciplinary areas. The former has four sections - Architecture, Urbanism, Design, and Technologies - and the latter has three - Drawing, Geometry and Computation; History and Theory; Social and Territorial Sciences.

In addition, the FA is organized into three other divisions: the Academic Division deals with registration and student records and is described in further detail under Academic Services, the Financial Division manages the budget and finances of the School and the Administrative Division deals with human resources and correspondence.



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MANAGEMENT

The School is managed by four councils. The Management Council is led by the President, who is the overall head of the School. The Scientific Council manages the scientific aspects of academic life, such as the approval of educational programmes, courses, and committees. The Pedagogic Council deals with the academic timetable and the evaluation of programmes, courses and students. The School Council approves the statutes, plan of activities and reports, including the budget, and ensures that the School is run in accordance with their stipulations.



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COURSES

COURSES

1st CYCLE

BACHELOR'S

The School offers three 180 ECTS 3-year Bachelor's (licenciatura) programmes in Architectural Studies, Design, and Fashion Design. These programmes are intended to provide basic training in these areas and prepare students for more advanced training at Master's level. The Bachelor's in Architectural Studies programme is common to all three Integrated Master's courses in Architecture.



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2nd CYCLE

INTEGRATED MASTER'S DEGREES

These courses offer 300 ECTS, 3+2-year Integrated Master's programmes in Architecture, Urbanism and Interior Design. All the programmes, which lead to professional degrees accredited by the Association of Portuguese Architects and the European Union, are closely linked to the School's programme for the Bachelor's degree in Architectural Studies, but may also be linked to programmes lasting 3 years or more completed elsewhere. The differences between the three programmes are related to the main area of specialisation, since all three prepare students for designing interiors, buildings, and urban plans. All the programmes include elective courses which enable each student to tailor their education to their specific needs and interests.

NON-INTEGRATED MASTER'S DEGREES

In addition, the FA offers 120 ECTS 2-year Master's programmes in Product, Communication, and Fashion Design. Students complete the degrees by submitting a Final Design Project or Dissertation produced during the 2nd semester of the 2nd year. In special cases they may complete the degree with an internship. In addition, the School is preparing two non-integrated Master's programmes in collaboration with the ULisboa Faculty of Fine-Arts: a Master's in Typographic Practices and a Master's in Service Design, which are scheduled to open in 2014-15.

ERASMUS MUNDUS MASTERS

The FA offers two European Master's courses in collaboration with other schools, one in the field of architecture and another in urbanism. The Master's in Sustainable Design in the Mediterranean World is offered in partnership with the Università di Sassari deli Studi (UniSS), Italy, and the Universidad de Alcalá de Henares, Madrid, Spain. The Master's in Planning and Policy for Environment, Landscape and City is offered in partnership with the Università di Venezia (IUAV) and Università degli Studi di Sassari (UniSS), Italy, and the Universitat de Girona (UdG) and Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB), Spain.

3rd CYCLE

DOCTORAL PROGRAMMES

The FA offers three main doctoral programmes in Architecture, Urbanism, and Design. The doctoral programme in Architecture is composed of five areas of specialisation: Design Theory and Practice, History and Theory, Building Technology and Management, Conservation and Rehabilitation, Drawing, and Computation. The doctoral programme in Urbanism addresses Urban Planning and Design and Management issues, but does not include separate areas of specialisation. This also is the case with the doctoral programme in Design, which covers product, communications and fashion design.

The three doctoral programmes include one year of coursework (60 ECTS) followed by a minimum of two and a maximum of four years of research (60+60 ECTS). In general, students take four or five years to complete the programme. A maximum of up to one year of leave of absence is allowed, which will not count as study time. The structure of the programmes is flexible, enabling each student to pursue his/her own research interests.

Coursework includes two mandatory courses each totalling 10 ECTS, namely Research Methods in the 1st semester and the Thesis Prep Seminar in the 2nd semester. In addition, it includes 20 ECTS of elective courses in each semester. At least half of the elective course credits need to be obtained in the area of specialisation in which students are enrolled. The other half can be taken in other areas or in other programmes offered by the School or elsewhere. It is not uncommon for students to take courses in other scientific areas (such as engineering or biology) outside the School or to spend a semester at another school, including foreign institutions with which the FA has an exchange agreement. The goal is to promote interdisciplinary work.

In addition, the FA offers two other doctoral programmes in partnership with other ULisboa schools: the Doctoral Programme in River Restoration and

Management in collaboration with the Instituto Superior Técnico (IST) and Instituto Superior de Agronomia (ISA), and the Doctoral Programme in Urban and Territorial Planning and Design in collaboration with the IST and Instituto de Gestão e Ordenamento do Território (IGOT), which is scheduled to open in 2014-15.

At the end of the first year, students take the qualifying exam. This exam consists of the defence of a research proposal, produced within the framework of the Thesis Prep Seminar, which will subsequently be developed. In the remaining years students develop their own research under the supervision of their advisors. Although students should develop their research independently, they can do so within the context of existing research projects. While developing their research, they also attend Research Labs, consisting of seminars in which they are asked to discuss their research with other students and professors.

ADVANCED STUDY PROGRAMMES

The School offers one-year Advanced Study programmes in several areas including Vernacular Architecture, Portuguese Urban Culture, Design and Computation, and Conservation and Rehabilitation. An Advanced Studies programme in Housing is being created and is expected to start in the academic year 2014-15. This programme will have the support of the Urban and Territorial Studies Division of the National Laboratory for Civil Engineering (LNEC) and the Lisbon City Council Housing Department, both of which have long-standing experience in research and the implementation of housing-related programmes. The Advanced Study programmes were designed with a structure similar to the first year of the doctoral programmes in order to facilitate the transition for students who wish to continue with an advanced Master's or PhD course by developing a minimum one-year or two-year thesis, respectively.

INTENSIVE AND SHORT COURSES

The School also offers short intensive programmes in specialist areas, targeted at professionals who wish to remain up-to-date with the latest developments in architecture, urbanism and design.

POST-DOCTORAL STUDIES

The School also welcomes researchers who wish to pursue their post-doctoral studies under the supervision of one of its professors or researchers, as part of an existing research group or ongoing project.



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TEACHING LANGUAGE

Classes are taught in Portuguese or in English. The School reinforces the university's policy that classes should be taught in English whenever there is a student in class who is not fluent in Portuguese. Many teachers are also fluent in other languages, such as Spanish, Italian, French and German, which facilitates communications with foreign students, particularly in one-to-one situations.

TEACHING STAFF

The FA teaching staff includes about 140 instructors, including architects, urbanists, designers, economists, geographers, sociologists, art historians, artists, and engineers. Around 115 of them hold a doctoral degree, one third of which have been awarded by a foreign university. In addition, a significant number of design studio instructors have their own professional practice and are award-winning designers. These combined aspects provide a rich and diverse learning environment that is connected to the real world. ●

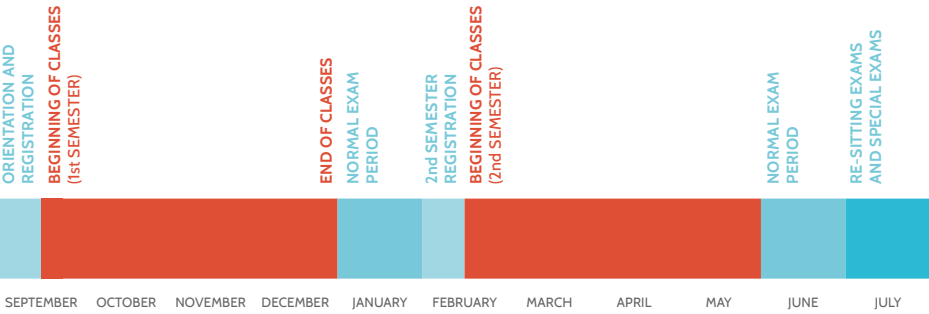
HOW TO APPLY



Individuals may apply to study on Bachelor's and Integrated Master's programmes via a national competition open to both national and international students. The application process takes place in July and is managed by the Ministry of Education and limited by numerous clausus. Applications for the 2nd cycle of Integrated Master's, non-integrated Master's, Doctoral, and Advanced Study programmes takes place between April and the end of August. The process includes a series of intermediate deadlines, and is managed by the School. Applications for post-doctoral studies may be submitted at any time and should be supported by the researcher with whom the applicant wishes to work.

ACADEMIC YEAR

The academic year starts at the beginning of September. The first two weeks of the 1st semester are reserved for orientation and registration. Classes start in the third week and continue until Christmas. The normal exam period is in January. The first two weeks in February are reserved for registration for 2nd semester. Classes then start in the third week and last until the end of May. June is the normal exam period. July is reserved for re-sitting exams and special exams (for athletes, workers, and finalists). The teaching period for each semester lasts 14 weeks.



ACADEMIC SERVICES



The academic services are provided by the Academic Division which is organised into three offices. The Graduate Office manages 1st and 2nd cycle programmes and is located in Building 2, the main administrative building. The Post-Graduate Office is located in Building 5 and manages 3rd cycle programmes and the Centre for Further Training which deals with intensive and short non-degree courses. The Mobility Office, located in Building 6, deals with national and international staff and student exchanges and also provides support for international students.

TUITION

Tuition fees are around 1,067.00 euros per year for the Bachelor's and Integrated Master's programmes, 3,500.00 euros for the two-year Master's Programmes and 6,500.00 euros for the 3-year doctoral programmes. Students who fail to complete their programme within the prescribed number of years will need to pay extra tuition fees for each additional semester. The annual tuition fees can be paid in 2, 4 or 10 instalments, the latter payment plan being intended for students with proven financial hardships. Tuition fees need to be paid on registration, in the 10th week of classes, or monthly, depending on the payment plan. Failure to comply with these rules will lead to the automatic cancellation of the student's registration.

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FINANCIAL AID



Financial aid is limited, although 1st and 2nd cycle students who live in Portugal are eligible to apply for a grant. The deadline for applications is in September and decisions are announced by the beginning of December.

3rd cycle students may apply for a scholarship from the Portuguese Foundation for Science and Technology (FCT) or from other funding agencies (Oriente Foundation, Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation, etc.). Typically these scholarships cover tuition and living expenses. Applications should be submitted in September for FCT scholarships and around March for other scholarships. FCT scholarships start in January and therefore do not cover the 1st semester of study. Other scholarships usually start in September.

There are a limited number of stipends available in exchange for work done at the School in services departments and research labs and, in rare cases, paid teaching assistantships. There are also research assistantships, awarded each semester, within the context of ongoing research projects.

RESOURCES

RESEARCH RESOURCES

THE RESEARCH CENTRE FOR ARCHITECTURE, URBANISM AND DESIGN (CIAUD)

The CIAUD is owned by the ULisboa FA and it is the only research centre based in a School of Architecture in Portugal. It includes 180 researchers and PhD students from several schools within and outside ULisboa, as well as the FA. It is organised into four departments, three of which correspond to the core scientific areas of the School – architecture, urbanism, and design – whilst the other involves the related area of ergonomics. Research is organised into several lines spanning the four divisions, thereby fostering cross-disciplinary research.

The Centre is directly funded by the Portuguese Foundation for Science and Technology (FCT) which contributes 300,000 euros per year. It also hosts several research projects that are directly funded by the FCT, representing an investment of 300,000 euros per year. In addition, certain research projects are funded either by public and private institutions or by European funds. Recent policy has been aiming to increase the number of these latter projects.

The scientific output can be measured by the amount of international papers published in journals, conference papers and books published by CIAUD researchers, which has resulted in it being classified as Excellent by FCT. The CIAUD also supports the organisation of conferences, seminars, and workshops by its members, all of which contribute towards creating a dynamic and international scientific atmosphere in the FA.



RESEARCH GROUPS

Professors, researchers and students are organised into groups to collaborate actively in developing research in a particular area of knowledge. These groups are linked to the Master's and doctoral programmes and to the research (CIAUD) and consultancy (PSC) centres which provide a framework for the development of theses, fundamental and applied research projects and specialist consultancy services. They have a significant history of related research projects and publications and collaboration with other similar Portuguese and international groups.

RESEARCH LABS

The FA has several specialist laboratories with advanced equipment, each coordinated by a researcher appointed to take care of their operations, maintenance, and expansion. These labs work in close collaboration with the research groups, Master's and doctoral programmes and research and consultancy centres, supporting the development of theses and projects. They are available for use by the academic and scientific community of the FA, but may also be used by the outside community. The terms and conditions for access are set out in regulations which aim to ensure safe and appropriate access, use, and maintenance. A user fee may be charged in order to contribute to financial sustainability.

CONSULTANCY SERVICES CENTRE (CPS)

The aim of the CPS is to develop applied research projects and provide value-added services for the scientific departments of the FA, namely, architecture, urbanism, and design. The Centre thus contributes towards promoting relations between academia and civil society, taking advantage of the specialist knowledge and researchers within the School. The Centre is also linked to other FA units such as the research centre (CIAUD), research groups and laboratories and the Technology Transfer Office.

TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER OFFICE (GETCPI)

The aim of the Technology Transfer Office is to protect and explore the economic value of knowledge and innovation produced at the FA, whilst also promoting entrepreneurship and fostering relations between academia and industry. The Office provides support for the registration and licensing of patents, utility models, trademarks, and industrial designs, as well as applications for funding for product development and the creation of spinoffs and start-ups based on protected intellectual property. The FA is also in the process of setting up its own incubator.

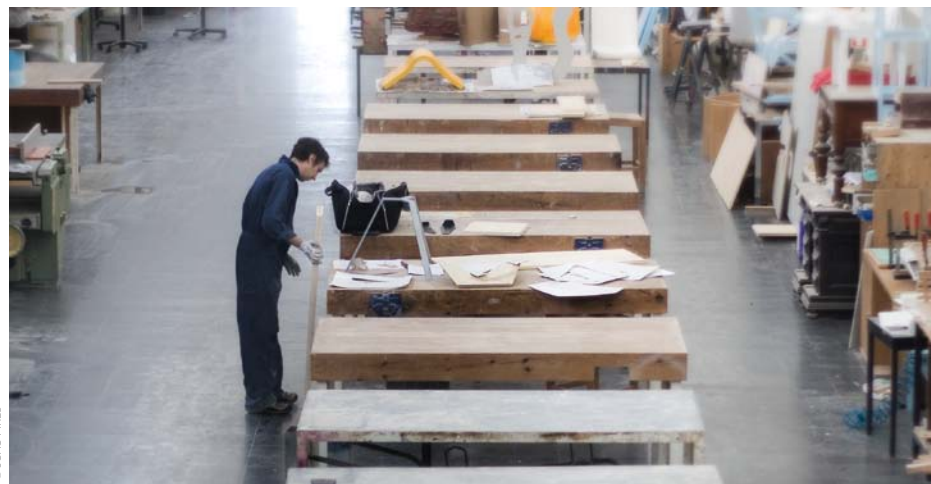
INCUBATOR

The FA has set up an in-house incubator whose goal is to support innovative ideas developed within the School. The idea is to identify projects developed by professors and students as part of their research and Master's or doctoral theses that have economic potential and help launch them on the market by creating spin-off and start-up companies.

MATERIAL RESOURCES

WORKSHOP FACILITIES

The FA has one of the largest workshop facilities in any school of its kind in Portugal, which includes carpentry, metalwork, and ceramics workshops. These facilities are used by students to produce physical models and mock-ups of their projects. The Digital Prototyping Lab is part of these facilities and includes several subtractive and additive technologies, such as laser-cutting, 3D printing, large-scale milling, and vinyl cutter machines.



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LIBRARY

The FA has a specialist architecture, urbanism, and design library which also contains many other works from related areas, such as engineering and the arts. In addition, FA students have access to libraries in other schools in the university and inter-library borrowing is also available, providing students with access to other university libraries in the country.

PUBLICATIONS CENTRE

The editorial office oversees the publication, distribution, promotion, and sale of the School's periodic and non-periodic publications, in collaboration with the research centre and School administration.

CARTOGRAPHY CENTRE

The FA possesses a cartography centre that provides the FA community with access to a wide range of historical and contemporary cartographic information on Portugal and Portuguese-speaking countries in paper and digital formats.



COMPUTER SYSTEMS CENTRE (CIFA)

The FA has the oldest computer systems centre in any school of Architecture in Portugal. CIFA maintains the School's internal computer network and guarantees external access to the internet, whilst also providing computer support for students and staff. In addition, it runs several computer rooms used in teaching, as well as a videoconference room and a 2D printing and scanning hub. A wireless network providing access to Eduroam is also available.

MULTIMEDIA CENTRE

The Multimedia Centre (CM) provides audio and video recording and playback facilities and has a substantial library of recorded lectures and conferences that can be accessed online.

IMAGE AND COMMUNICATIONS OFFICE

This office coordinates all the School's internal and external editorial and communications activities. It also is in charge of managing the School's external image, using the web site and other official media. In addition, it promotes and manages cultural activities related to the School's scientific areas, including conferences, colloquia and book launches.

EXTERNAL RELATIONS AND ACADEMIC EXCHANGE OFFICES

The FA's relations with public and private organisations in and outside the country are managed by the External Relations Office, which also is in charge of fund-raising. The Academic Exchange Office is responsible for managing national and international exchange programmes with other schools and for providing support for all international students. These offices cooperate to promote the FA externally.

The FA has a wide range of protocols with schools in Africa, Latin America, North America, Asia, Europe and Oceania, under which it receives over 350 students and staff annually. In addition, around 10% of the enrolled students are also foreigners, giving the FA a strong international atmosphere.

BUILDING WORK AND MAINTENANCE OFFICE

This office is in charge of running and maintaining the buildings and ensuring proper use of the School's facilities.



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ALUMNI OFFICE

The aim of the Alumni Office is to ensure that former students remain in contact and involved with the School, by participating in its academic, social, and fund-raising activities. Both formerly enrolled and mobility students are considered alumni and can therefore apply to the Alumni Office.

STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION (AEFA)

The FA Students' Association is an old organisation that represents students' interests in the administration of the School and organises a series of leisure and academic activities, such as parties, sports events, exhibitions and lectures.

EXTERNAL ORGANISATIONS

Several external organisations have their headquarters at the School, such as the Academy of Portuguese-Speaking Schools of Architecture and Urbanism (*AEULP - Academia de Escolas de Arquitetura e Urbanismo de Língua Portuguesa*), the Portuguese Urbanists Association (*AUP - Associação dos Urbanistas Portugueses*), and the Portuguese Colour Association (*Associação Portuguesa da Cor*).

ADDITIONAL FACILITIES

The School also offers other facilities that provide important services for students and staff, including a bookshop, a stationer's, a copy and printing centre and a computer shop.



QUICK GUIDE

AT THE FACULTY

WHERE TO EAT

There are several places where students and staff can eat, either in the School or nearby. The School offers a snack bar that provides quick meals and snacks and there is a university canteen that serves full meals at subsidised rates just across the street from the FA. The university restaurant, used for more formal meals, is located on the top floor of the same building. In addition, FA students and staff may use snack bars from other Schools on campus or choose from a wide variety of restaurants located in the nearby Ajuda neighbourhood.

SPORTS

There is a sports pavilion (CEDAR) on campus which offers a wide variety of sports facilities. Students and staff also have access to facilities at other university locations, including the University Stadium.

FINDING ACCOMMODATION

There is no accommodation on campus, although a new hall of residence is scheduled to be built in 2014. The university has several residences scattered around Lisbon although they are not sufficient to meet the demand. Consequently, students often rent rooms in private houses or share flats with other students.

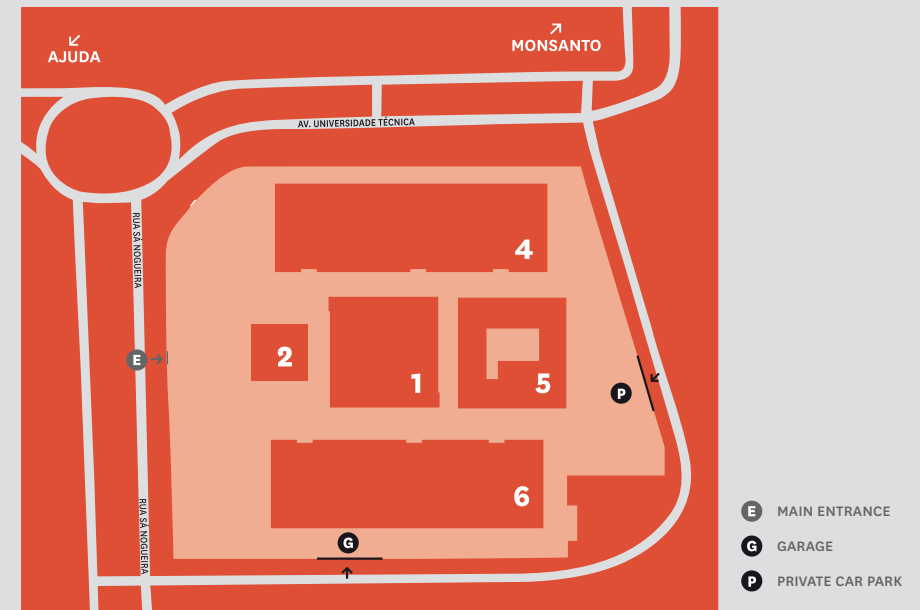
